## CHAPTER IV

### FINDING AND DISCUSSION

This chapter, the discussions are presented under the following; (1) finding of the study, and (2) discussion

#### 4.1 Finding Of The Study

##### 4.1.1 Data Presentation And Data Analysis

The data is presented in tabular form and statistically analyzed as a percentage graph. The students were given about 25 questions by the researcher in the form of five options to choose from and 20 minutes to answer. Then answers are taken from them. only then does the researcher study their answers very carefully. In this way, the researcher found out what difficulties students face in learning English and the analysis process was carried out at MA Muhammadiyah 01 Palembang.

#### **4.1.2 Analysis of Data Needed by Researchers**

Students of class X IPA and IPS MA Muhammadiyah 01 Palembang were selected as participants here. 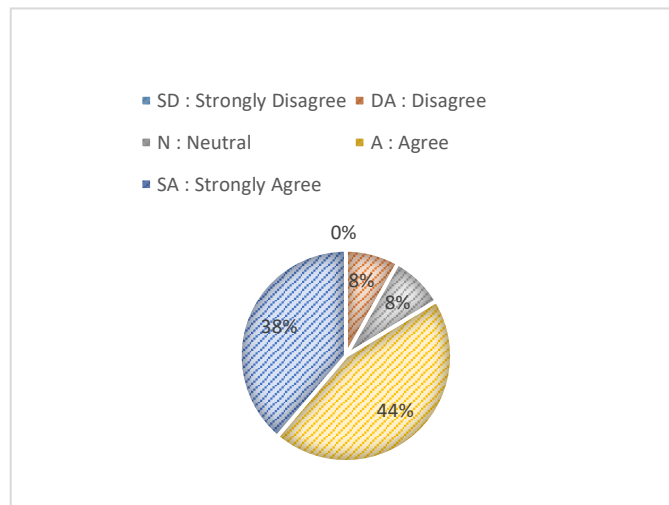

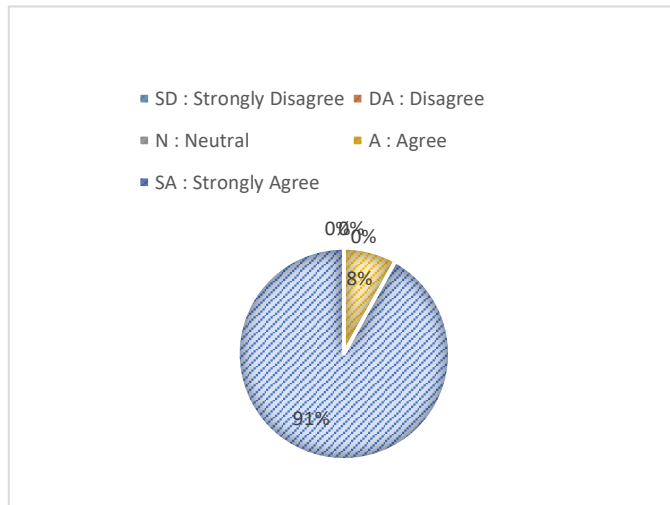
#### **Questionnaire Result**

#### **Graph 1. I Feel Lazy When I Do Questions Related To English**



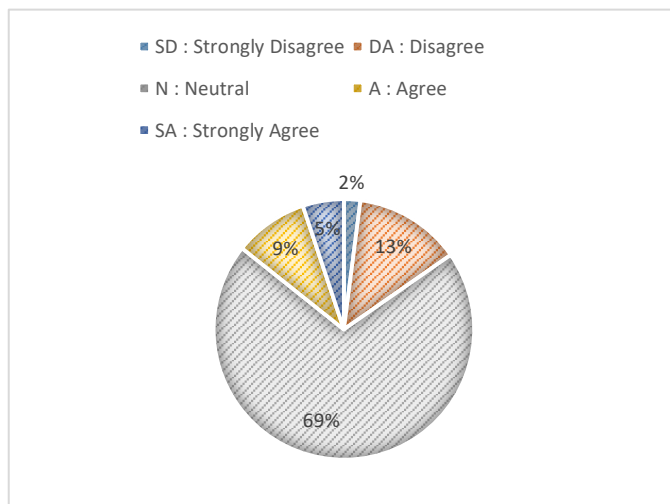

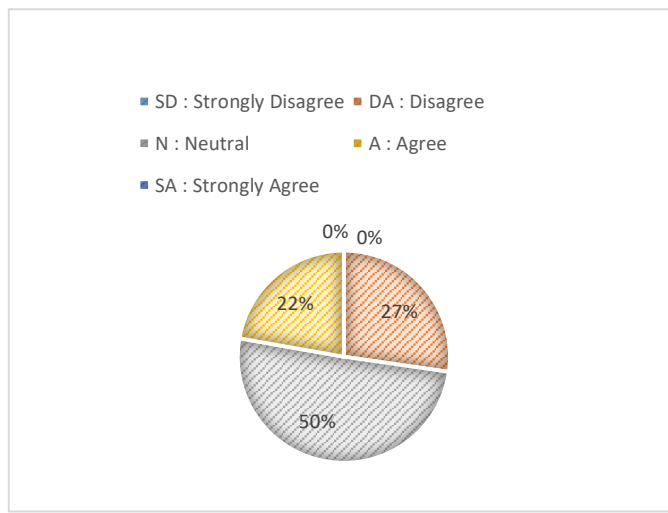
**Graph 3. I Lack Confidence In Learning English When The Teacher Explains**



Based on the statement “*I lack confidence in learning English when the teacher explains*” from 36 informants, there is 1 informant (2%) 'strongly

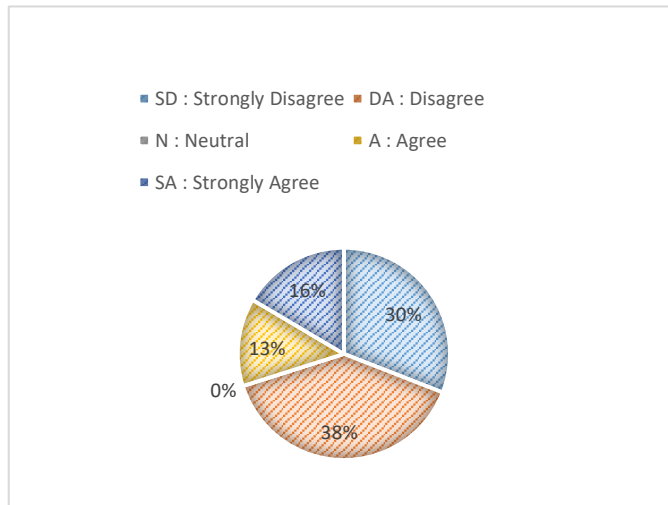

**Graph 4. When Studying English Do I Often Pay Attention To It**



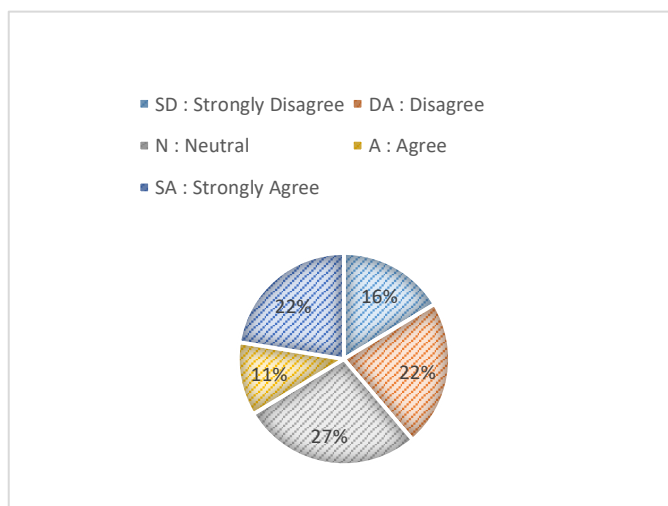

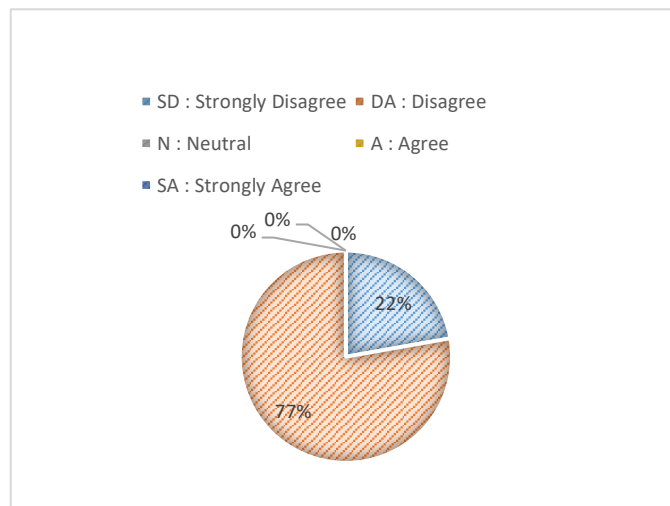
**Graph 6. My Teacher Often Gives Varied Methods When Teaching**

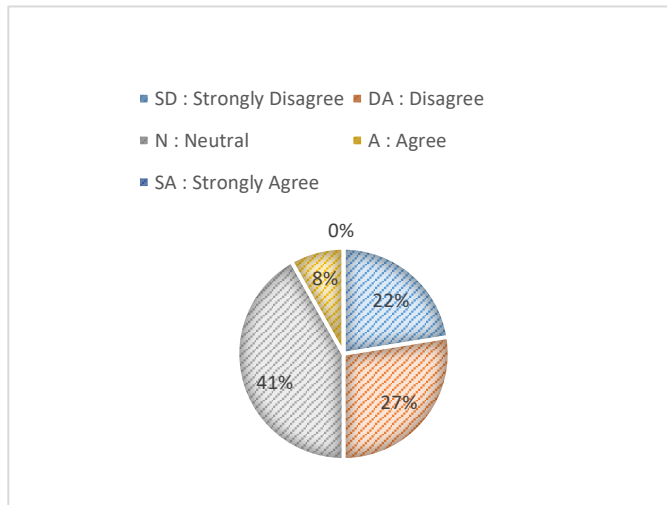
**Graph 7. My Teacher Often Gives Varied Methods When Teaching**

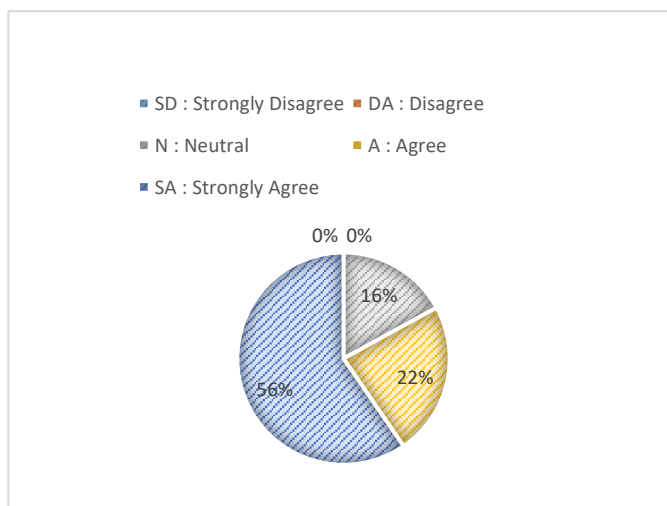
**Graph 8. When At Home I Repeat The English Lesson That The Teacher Has Given**





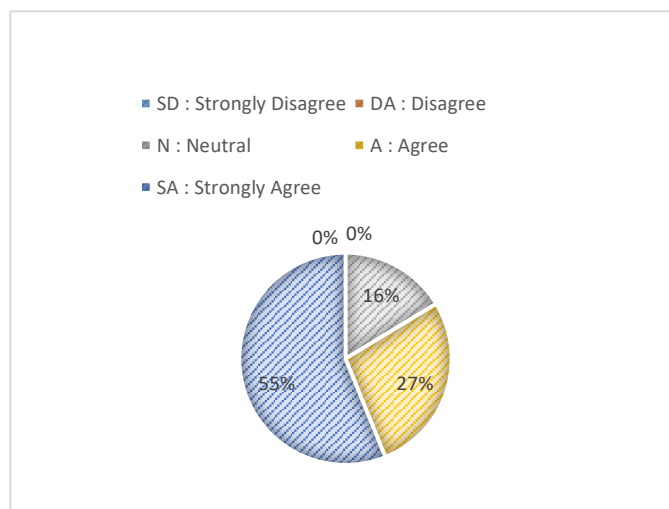

### **Graph 9. Do You Have Difficulty Pronouncing English Words**



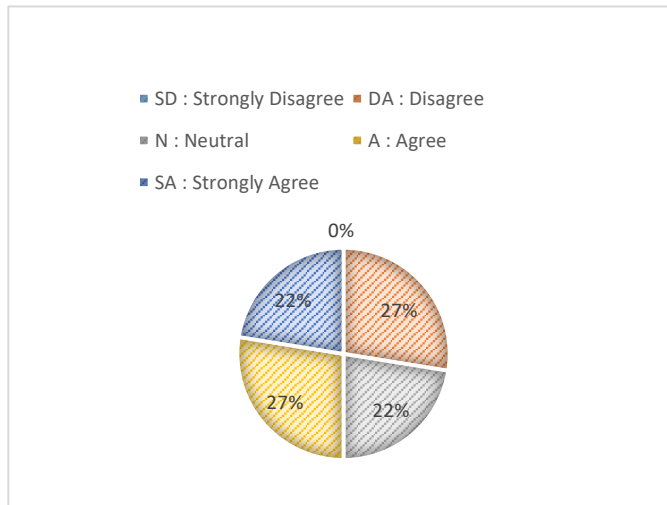

**Graph 10. Do You Feel Embarrassed When You Speak English In Front Of Other People**



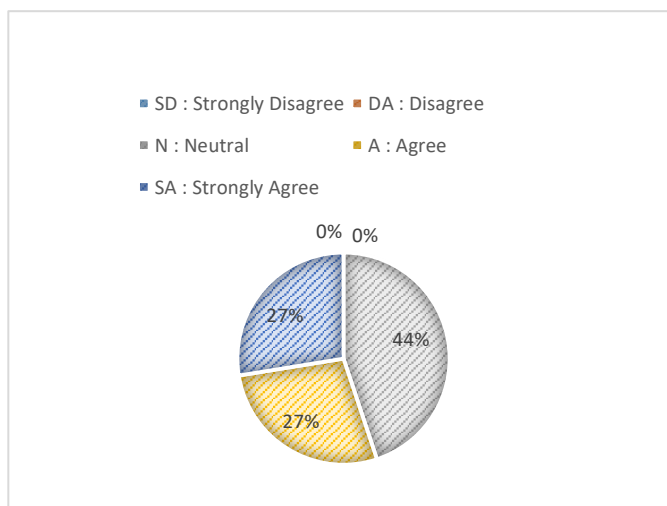

**Graph 11. Is There a Tendency To Daydream When The Teacher Explains The Material**



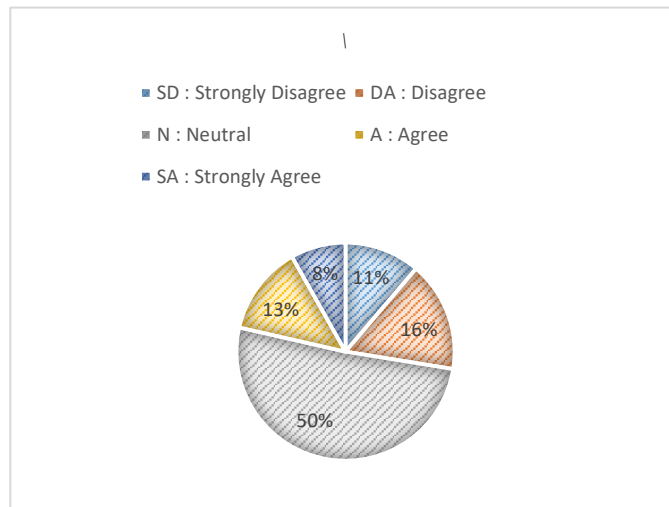

### **Graph 12. Do You Learn More English Than Other People**



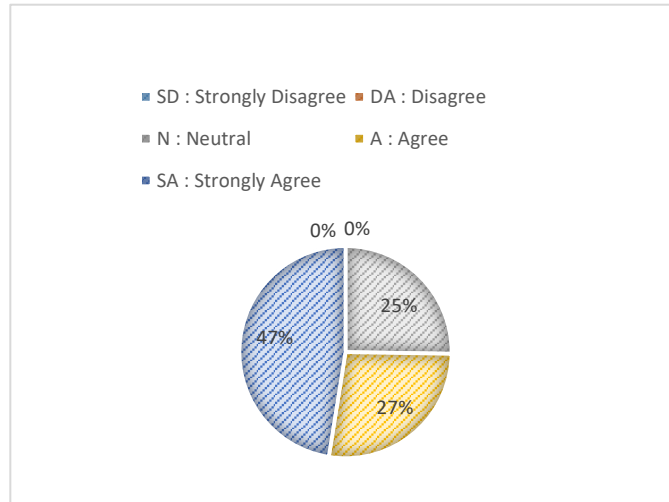

**Graph 13. Do You Enjoy Learning English**



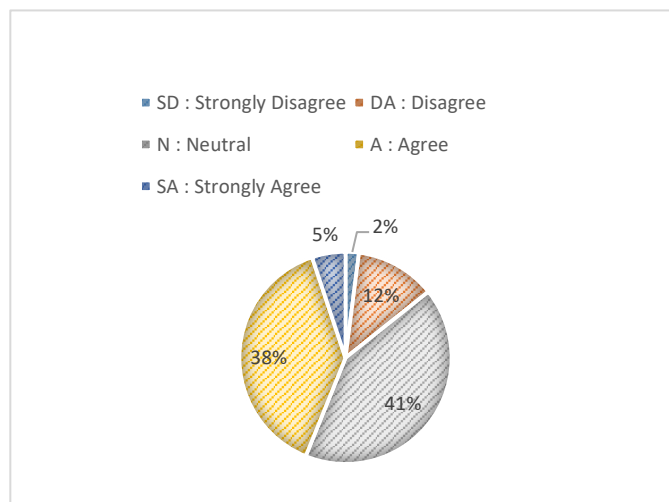

**Graph 14. Did You Listen To The Information Conveyed By The Teacher About The Material Being Explained**



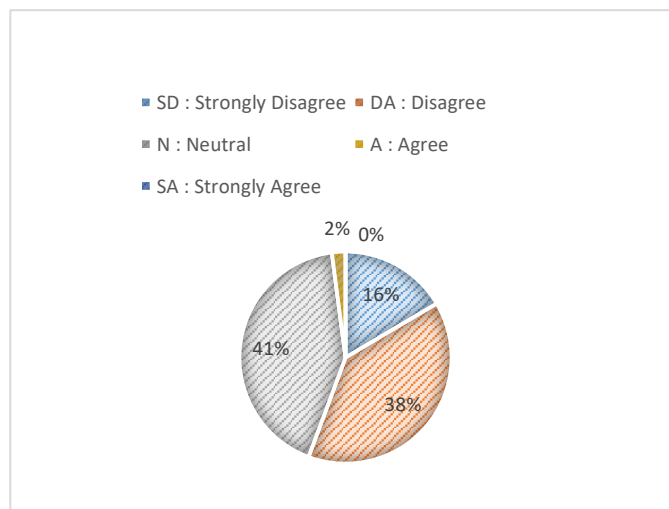

**Graph 15. Do You Have Good Communication With Teachers**



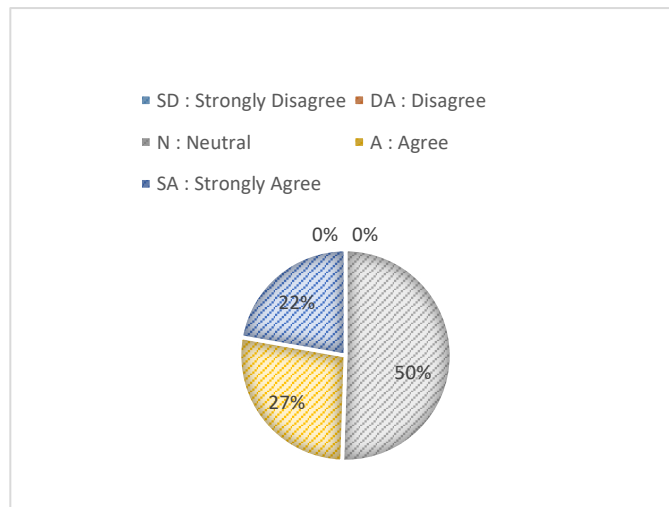

**Graph 16. When You Learn English, Do You Often Play**



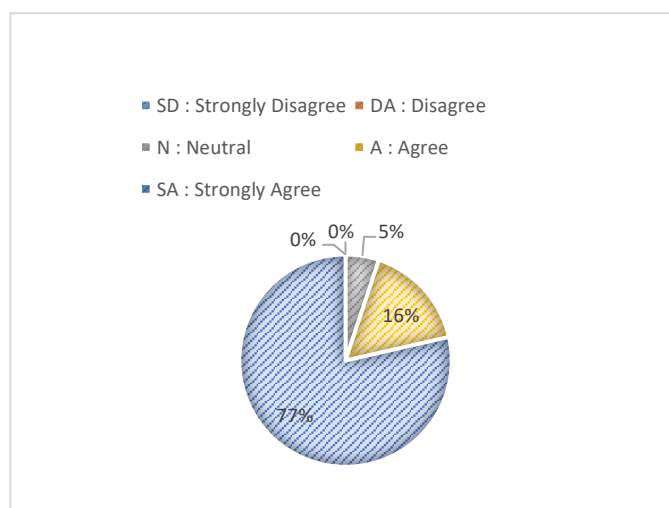

**Graph 17. When i Study English, i Don't Listen Much**



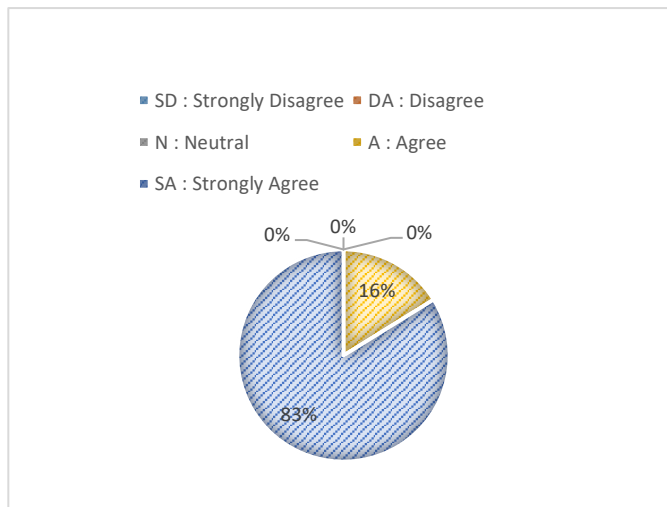

**Graph 18. Lack Of Textbooks Makes It Diffucult To Learn English**



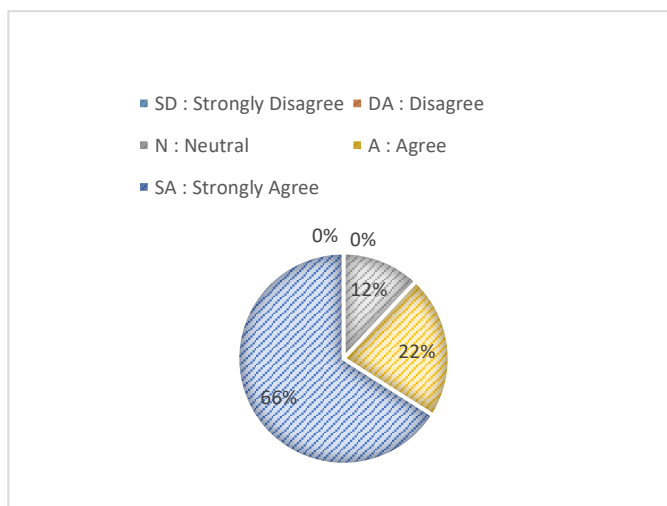

**Graph 20. I’m Afraid To Learn English In Front Of My Classmated**

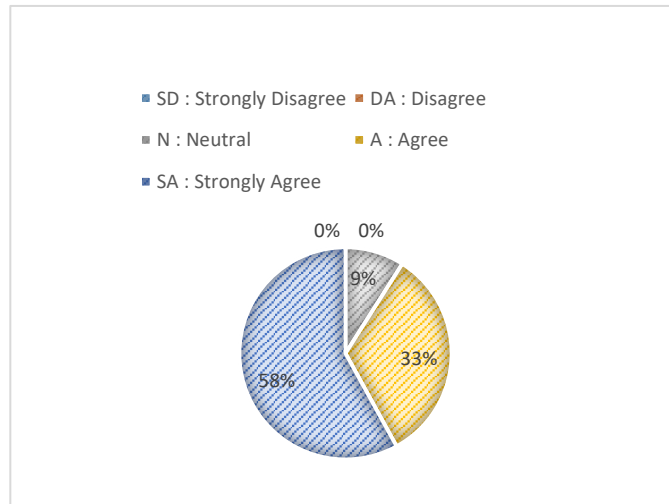


Based on the statement "*I'm afraid to learn English in front of my classmates*" from 36 informants, there are 4 informants (12%) 'Neutral', 8



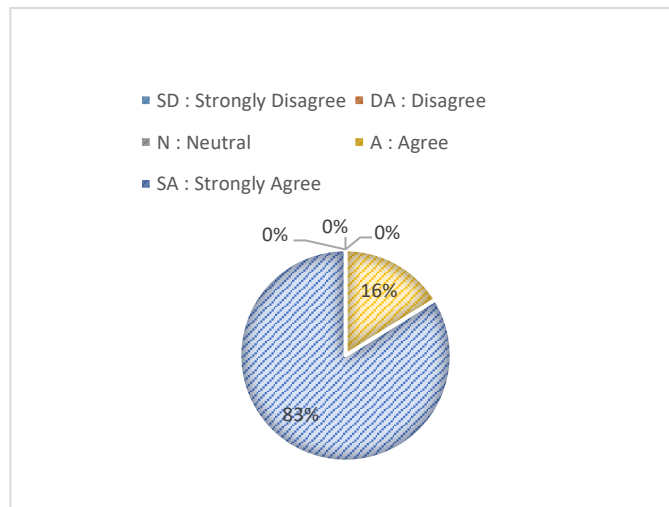

**Graph 21. Speak English With Yourself Will Improve Your Speaking Skills**



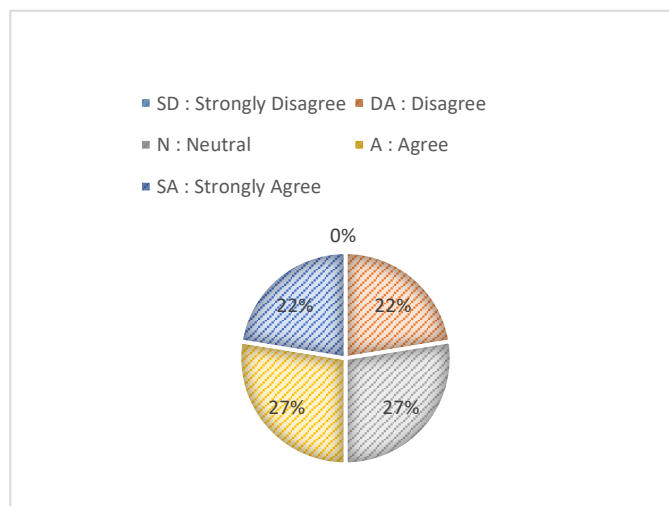

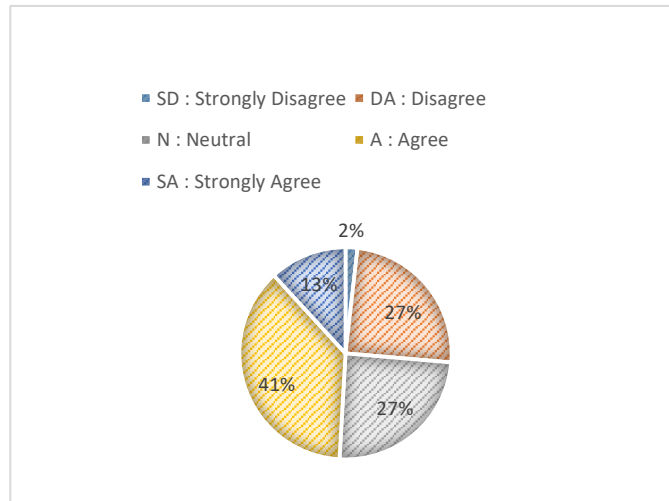
**Graph 23. i Have Difficulty Understanding Vocabulary To Facilitate Speaking**



Based on the statement “*I have difficulty understanding vocabulary to facilitate speaking*” from 36 informants, there are 8 informants (22%) 'disagree',

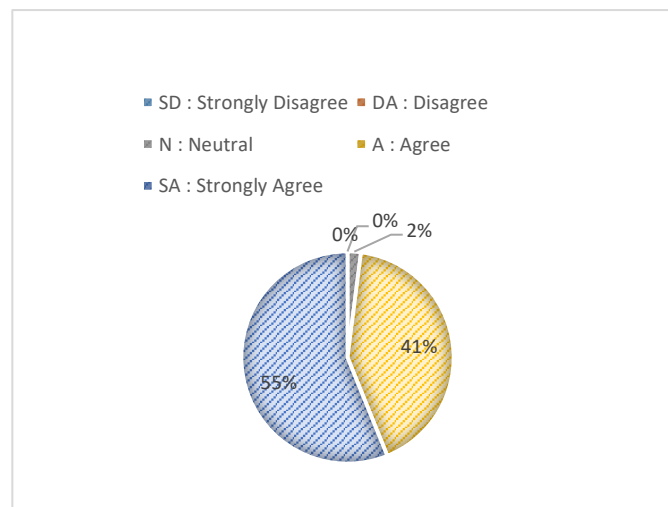

#### **4.2. Discussion of The Reseach**

After discuss about the finding of the reseach, the reseacher can know that the results of this reseach are:

The survey results were obtained from questionnaires, observations, and the emergence of responses from difficulties in learning English among students of MA Muhammadiyah 01 Palembang. Before exploring students' intellectual abilities, the study found problems with students' mental abilities, in this case, the "self-confidence" that almost every student has. Mental problems such as fear of being wrong, an embarrassment to be ridiculed by other friends, feeling like they don't understand English terms, lack of clear explanations from the teacher about the material, lack of learning media such as books, and difficulty speaking English. These problems can be classified as psychological/attitude (emotional) problems

that arise from habits that shape the soul and character of students. So that this lack of self-confidence is a big problem that researchers found in this study.

The results and discussion above show that most students have learning difficulties because of psychological problems that shape the character of students if they are not confident when learning, make mistakes and are embarrassed in learning to give. confident so that students are afraid to learn English. and also other influences such as the way the teacher explains and the book facilities provided by the school.

#### **5.1 Conclusion**

The process of learning English cannot be separated from the emergence of various difficulties for students in this context, especially for students of MA Muhammadiyah 01 Palembang. The following results from the researcher summarize:

- (2) lack of practice in using English to communicate in daily life
- (3) students' vocabulary is not enough. Based on this research, a conclusion

can be made.

Choosing the right method can affect the various difficulties that students will face in the next English lesson. It is hoped that the results of this study can be used by teachers to improve their English teaching methods for students who cannot speak English.

#### **5.2 Suggestions**

Furthermore, teachers also need to diversify the problems of different students so that when teaching they are always related to the background based on the skill level and needs of students. During this research, the researcher gained insights that can be used as a reference for making recommendations:

1. In every lesson the teacher must begin to motivate students to be confident so that students are not afraid of making mistakes in the process of teaching material according to student needs.

2. The process of learning English should be done when necessary. Direct student participation/practice.

3. improve student interaction with the SCL (Student-Centered Learning) approach

4. Before starting the learning process, it is necessary to plan through the RPP (Lesson Plan). through the adjustment of materials, means, and methods.
